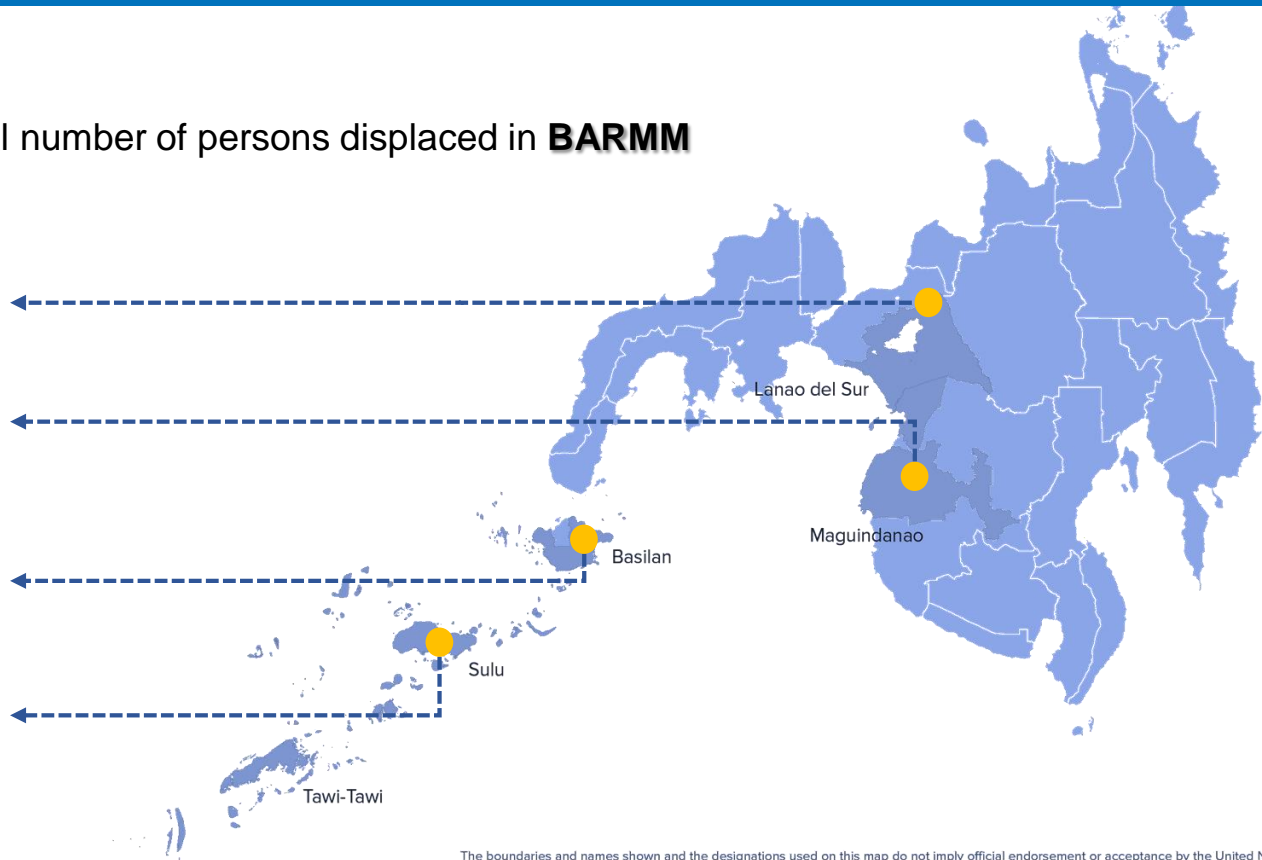

Issues:

- Congestions at the evacuation centers where at least 5 families are occupying each classroom in DAES, Datu Hoffer Municipality;
- Far distance of the evacuation centers to the water source;
- Disruption of modular classes of IDPs;
- Disruption of farming activities of the IDPs, some have left their peanuts and rice crops.

ISSUES AND GAPS

Marawi Displacement

- ❑ **Access to Assistance**
 - Home-based IDPs do not receive as much assistance as those in transitory sites
 - Sharers at the transitory sites are complaining of exclusion of assistance
 - There are existing CBEC where families claimed to be IDPs and are not accessing assistance
 - Beneficiary selection for assistance (e.g. shelter) prioritize home-owners and renters at MAA are only secondary regardless of vulnerability especially permanent shelters.
 - There are also vulnerable families who had returned and are needing assistance like those at the transitory sites
- ❑ **Less participation of IDPs** to matters affecting them.
 - There are IDPs who were not able to register under the Kathakor. This may result to exclusion of some IDPs as government assistances make use the Kathakor as the basis.
 - Less participation of IDPs on rehabilitation, return. If they are able, issues and concerns are not fully accommodated
- ❑ **Access to of food and livelihood assistance**
- ❑ **Access to WASH facilities**
 - Insufficient water supply is the prevailing issue in transitory sites
 - Poor hygiene and sanitation which increase health risk especially for vulnerable people (full septic tanks, clogged drainage, no waste management)
- ❑ **Tension build up** at the transitory sites due to various reasons such as water distribution schedule, leadership between official and unofficial occupants, assistance provide etc.
- ❑ **Limited access to basic services** (BHS, CHO, Hospital, market, school) due to limited mobility, insufficient resources available (for the host communities and IDPs)
- ❑ **Lack of CCCM.** Lack of dedicated camp managers or administrators in the transitory sites that would receive the feedback and liaise with decision makers as regards the protection and humanitarian issues they are facing in the sites. Strong CCCM can be helpful to address the issues or problems existing at the transitory sites.
- ❑ **Prolong return to the place of origin.**

❑ **55 families** are still staying on makeshifts at a private own lot. These families declined the offer of MSWO to be transferred to one of the school in the municipality. Among the identified needs of the IDPs are:

- Requested to be provided with tents
- Hygiene kits
- Food
- Improvement of latrine and water source

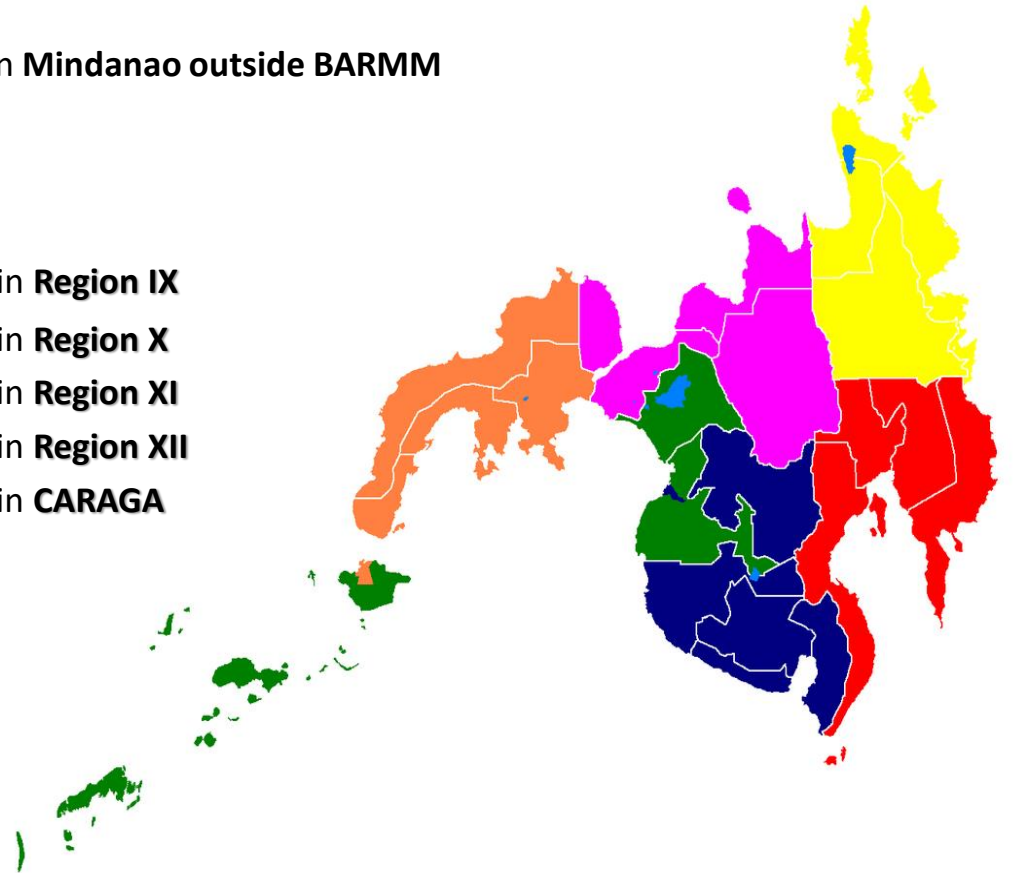

- There are a total of 103 families that are still displaced in Iligan City who are occupying makeshifts: **66 families in Brgy. Dulag and 37 families in Brgy. Kalilangan.** The IDPs have received GI sheets from the Armed Forces of the Philippines but are needing other materials to build their temporary shelter since they were advised not to return to their habitual residences for safety and security reasons. Other express need of the IDPs is food as they are dependent on the support from their host families.

□ **Zamboanga City**

- **59 families (295 individuals) were forced to flee their homes** due to continuous heavy rains that have caused **flooding in five barangays – Talisayan, Taluksangay, Talabaaan, Culianan, Cabaluay in Zamboanga City.** There were 188 houses that were damaged by the strong wind – 51 were totally damaged and 137 were partially damage. *(16 September 2020)*
