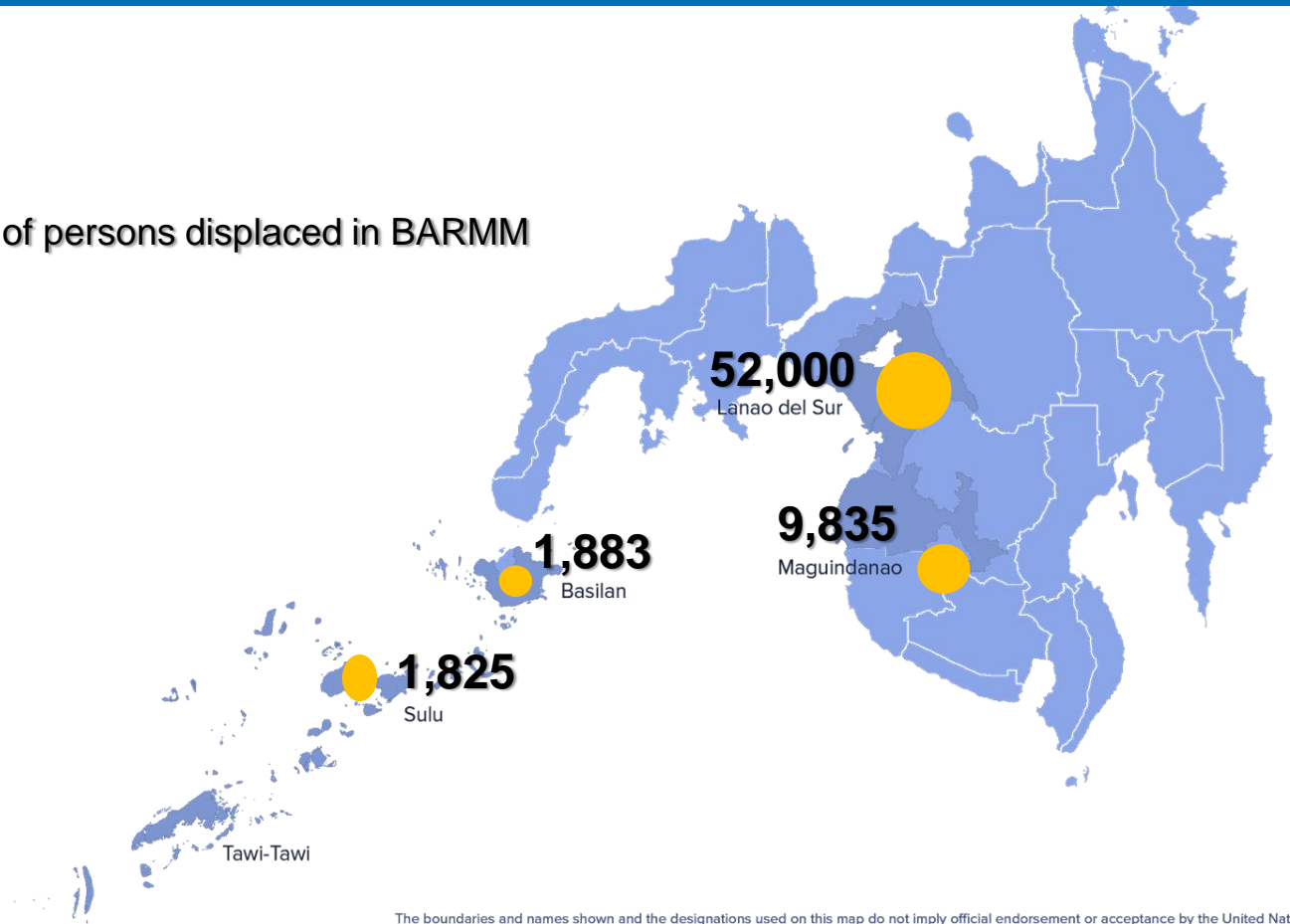

Updates on Disaster in the Province of Maguindanao

as of March 1, 2021

Existing IDPs

- ❑ IDP families in Gundulungan Municipality was decreased from **399 to 349 IDP families** and Municipality. Incident was happened on February 7, 2021 at Sitio Maringen and Sitio Tumagudtud of Barangay Datalpandan due to mortar shelling and machine gun from helicopter landed in area because there are allegedly fully armed groups rebels in the area.
- ❑ IDP families South Upi was increased from 59 to 111 IDP families inside Evacuation Site. MSWO and MDRMMO conducted validation recently and found out that aside from 59 IDP families staying in Poblacion Itaw, there are other 52 IDP families are staying in the EC.
- ❑ **243** families displaced from boundary of Sitio RS, Brgy. Panadtaban, Rajah Buayan and Barangay Masulot, Sultan Sa Barongis, evacuated to Sitio Proper, Brgy. Panadtaban of Rajah Buayan, Barangay Masulot and Barangay Darampua of Sultan Sa Barongis municipality due to family feud between the two groups unmentioned in the area. They were evacuated on February 14, 2021 at around 4:00 in the afternoon due to family feud.
- ❑ **175** IDP families in Barangay Masulot, Sultan Sa Barongis is still existing and they are coming from Sitio RS, Brgy. Panadtaban of Rajah Buayan, Maguindanao.

Newly Opened Evacuation Centers:

- ❑ There are newly opened evacuation sites from municipality of Shariff Saydonan Mustapha and Sultan Sa Barongis, Maguindanao .
 - ❑ One (1) IDP Family were evacuated to Pagatin Day Care Center due to harassment in Military Detachment on February 28, 2021 at around 2:10 in the morning in Cowboy, Pagatin 1, Shariff Saydona Mustapa by un-identified rebels group resulted to one (1) totally house burned owned by Talib Kasim.
 - ❑ **150** families displaced from Sitio Proper, Barangay Gadungan, Sultan Sa Barongis Municipality, evacuated to housebased at Sitio Libal, Barangay Kulambog, Sultan Sa Barongis municipality (adjacent barangay of Gadungan) on February 26, 2021 at around 11:00 in afternoon due to family feud between Uyag Galmak (barangay Chairman of brgy. Gadungan) and Norsama Bulinog, (National Guard, BIAF-MILF). As of the moment, assessment is going on.

Damaged Houses

Total numbers of Damaged Houses are fourteen (14) Totally Damaged.

- ❑ 13 totally damaged houses at South Upi.
- ❑ 1 totally damaged house at Pagatin 1, Shariff Saydona Mustapha Municipality.

There were also 4 partially damaged houses and 1 totally damaged in brgy. Katidtuan, Kabuntalan last February 18, 2021. No reported casualties and massive displacement.

Common Needs and Gaps

- Regular ration of food packs in all areas
 - Provision of sleeping kits and other essential non-food items for the Evacuation Centers in Rajah Buayan
 - Provision of folding beds
 - Need to put up emergency latrines in the evacuation centers
 - Provision of potable water for drinking
 - Need to establish/strengthen CCCM structure

Needs Analysis


NEEDS ANALYSIS	Recommendation
Food	Regular ration of food is recommended to be done while the IDPs are still in evacuation centers, housebased and makeshifts. Because of the community lockdown, the IDP families can't find decent source of living for daily subsistence. A regular support for food is recommended especially for the BLGU, MLGU and MSSD-Maguindanao.
Shelter	Since these municipalities are prone to evacuation, the MLGU is recommended to draft a comprehensive plan of emergency response especially identifying safe place for massive evacuation and consider a plan to build temporary shelter for evacuation.
WASH	Also to consider to build or provide wash facilities to accommodate the displaced families.
Education	A financial assistance thru Angat Bangsaomoro: Kabataan Tungo Sa Karunungan Program is recommended.
HLP	A go and see visit activity prior to an advice of returning home is recommended to really assess the sectoral condition of the displaced families in their places of origins.
Health	A regular visit and health check up for the senior citizens and pregnant women is recommended. Regular visits of the BHWs to the evacuation site is recommended to really see the health condition of the displaced families.
Core Relief Items	Maternity kits for pregnant and lactating women is recommended. Relief items like milk, diaper, baby clothes are recommended to be distributed to the IDP families.
Gender base Violence (GBV)	There were cases of domestic violence among couples but they can resolve it by their own. To less the incidence of domestic violence, it is needed to strengthen the advocacy on VAWC.

Other recommendation


- The affected families were psychologically and emotionally in despair due to the impact of the armed conflict. Stress debriefing is highly recommended to lessen their fear, distress and discomfort in the evacuation center.

INTERVENTIONS

(MSSD-BARMM & MSSD-MAGUINDANAO)

- MSSD conducted **psychosocial activities** for children and women in coordination with MLGU.
 - Distributed **food packs (twice) and Non food items** like sleeping kits and kitchen utensils.
 - Provided cash assistance to 1 dead and 4 injured during the ambush last January 3, 2021. (Php 10,000 burial assistance and Php 5000 worth of **cash assistance to 4 injured in South Upi, Maguindanao.**
 - Provided **cash assistance to 13 household whose houses were burnt in South Upi, Maguindanao.**
 - MSSD- BARMM provided **half sack of rice to 423 IDPs in Mamasapano**
 - MSSD-Maguindanao provided **emergency assistance to 21 households whose houses were damaged due to floods at Matanog.**
 - MSSD-Maguindanao provided **food packs as Pabaon to 65 IDPs in Talayan**
 - □MSSD-Maguindanao provided **272 food packs to IDPs in Brgy. Kusiong and Tapian, Datu Odin Sinsuat, Maguindanao.**

OTHER INTERVENTIONS

- Datu Saudi Ampatuan LGU has extended 4 kilos pack of rice per family to the 639 affected families.
 - PDRRM has initial assistance 50 food packs to the affected families in Rajah Buayan and 75 food packs to the affected families who are evacuated to municipality of Sultan Sa Barongis, Maguindanao. Food packs is compose of 3 cans sardines, 3 pcs. of noodles and 3 kilos rice.

Issues/Concern and needs gaps

WASH

Estimated 65% of the total IDP families across three transitory sites were having difficulties in using their CR due to full septic tanks and insufficient water supply available in the area, some of the family were digging beside their septic tank where can waste goes and other were connecting their septic tanks pipe to the drainage canal as their alternative way to used their CR but it produced foul smell that can be possible causes of different diseases.

Insufficient Supply of water is still concern of the IDP families in the transitory sites in which made their situation harder due to its limited schedule of delivery like once in two weeks schedule , some of the families particularly in Area 6 were paying for fuel for the tanker truck to deliver water in the area and other areas were buying in water refilling station for 15-25 pesos per container for their drinking water usage.

Food Security and Livelihood

Estimated 60% of the total families in the transitory sites has no livelihood or source of income due to limited job offer within the vicinity and lack of livelihood assistance; Selected families from the Barangays in MAA where able to received cash assistance from MSSD-BARMM for their start-up capital for livelihoods;

Most of the family expressed that they have difficulties in accessing nutritious food and food assistance due to pandemic situation and lack of budget to buy their stuff or daily needs.

Safety and Security

- On February 18, 2021 , a fire incident happen in Marawi Pilot Elementary School located in Sagonsongan Area 2 in which 2 classrooms were damaged and fortunately there was no recorded houses were damaged and casualties; suspected cause of fire was the children playing inside the school and burned a book where fire starts
- Limited movement of the IDPs due to COVID-19 quarantine status made their living situation harder and difficult to find job opportunities; AFP, BPAT and IPAT are present in the area and regularly conduct security roving inspection to maintain peace and order in the area.
- In Boganga TS, allegedly illegal drug selling are present in the area according to the IDP volunteers and division leaders, IDPs were afraid about the issue.

Health

limited access to medical services and assistance for the IDPs especially PWSN with chronic illness.

Key Protection Issues

Persisting issues:

- Limited support extended to the displaced families both by government and humanitarian agencies.
- Some displaced families expressed anxiety over shortage of food if displacement continue for a longer period of time.
- 25 families are cramped at the displacement site located in Brgy Langong, social distancing is difficult to practice. Lack of privacy in their temporary settlement was also raised by the women.

Immediate IDP Needs:

- Food
- Hygiene kits
- Mosquito nets
- Blankets or *malong*
- Mats
- Plastic tarpaulins for partition
- Solar lanterns

Responses

- Continues protection monitoring by i-PART; referral of the protection issues raised by IDPs to the Provincial LGU.
- LGU-Hadji Mohamed Ajul initiated a dialogue with the elderlies for the peaceful settlement of the feud. (*there is no updates as of the moment*)
- Establishment of a military detachment in Sitio Pekok, Brgy Langong (50m from community).
- Referral to MSWO on identified issues faced by the IDP's from Brgy. Bohebacca.
- Temporary deployment of MILF-BIAF at the incident site (returned to their camp base.)
- MPOC orders the IDPs that they can safely return to their place of origin. (*43 families have returned; 2 families remain displaced*)

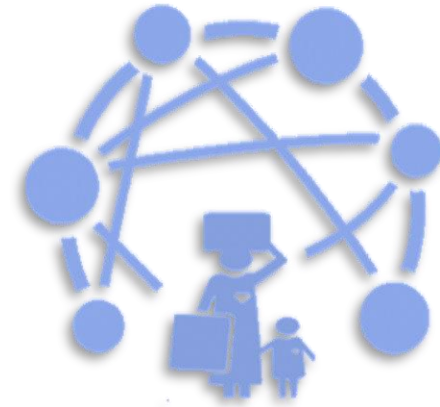

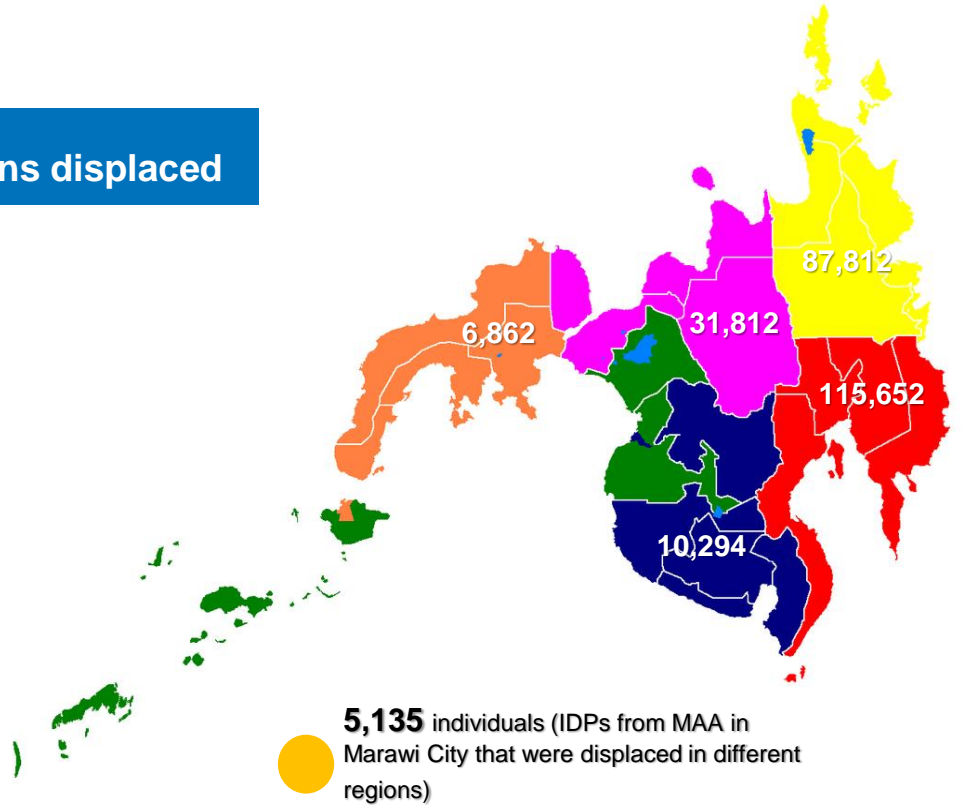

Interventions/Assistance Given

IDPs that returned to their place of origin (those declared by MGB as safe zones) were given financial assistance (5,000.00-10,000.00). They were also provided by food and non-food items.

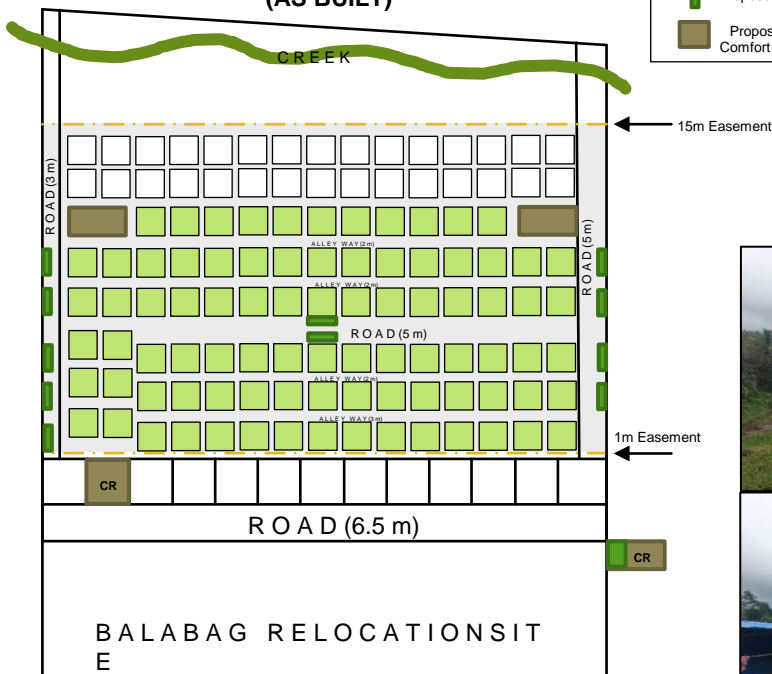
