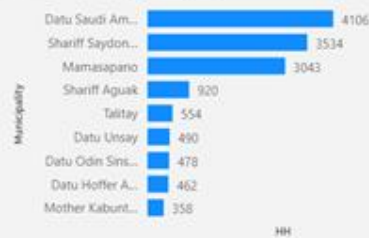

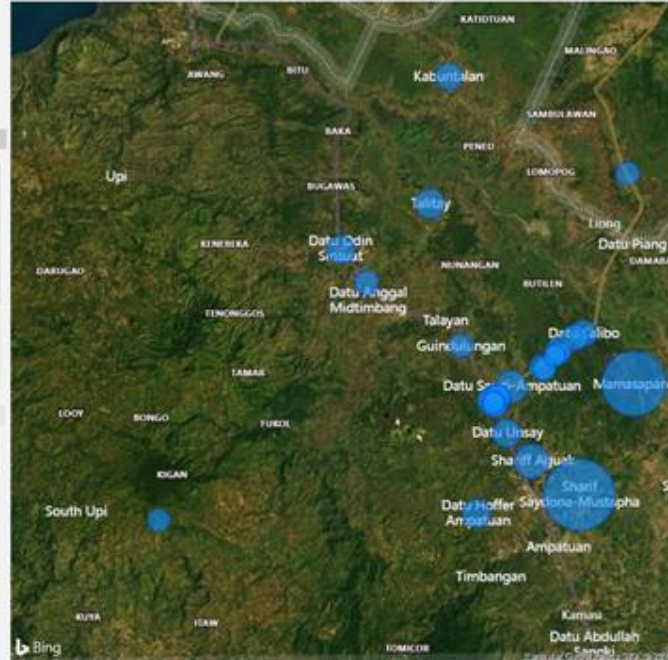

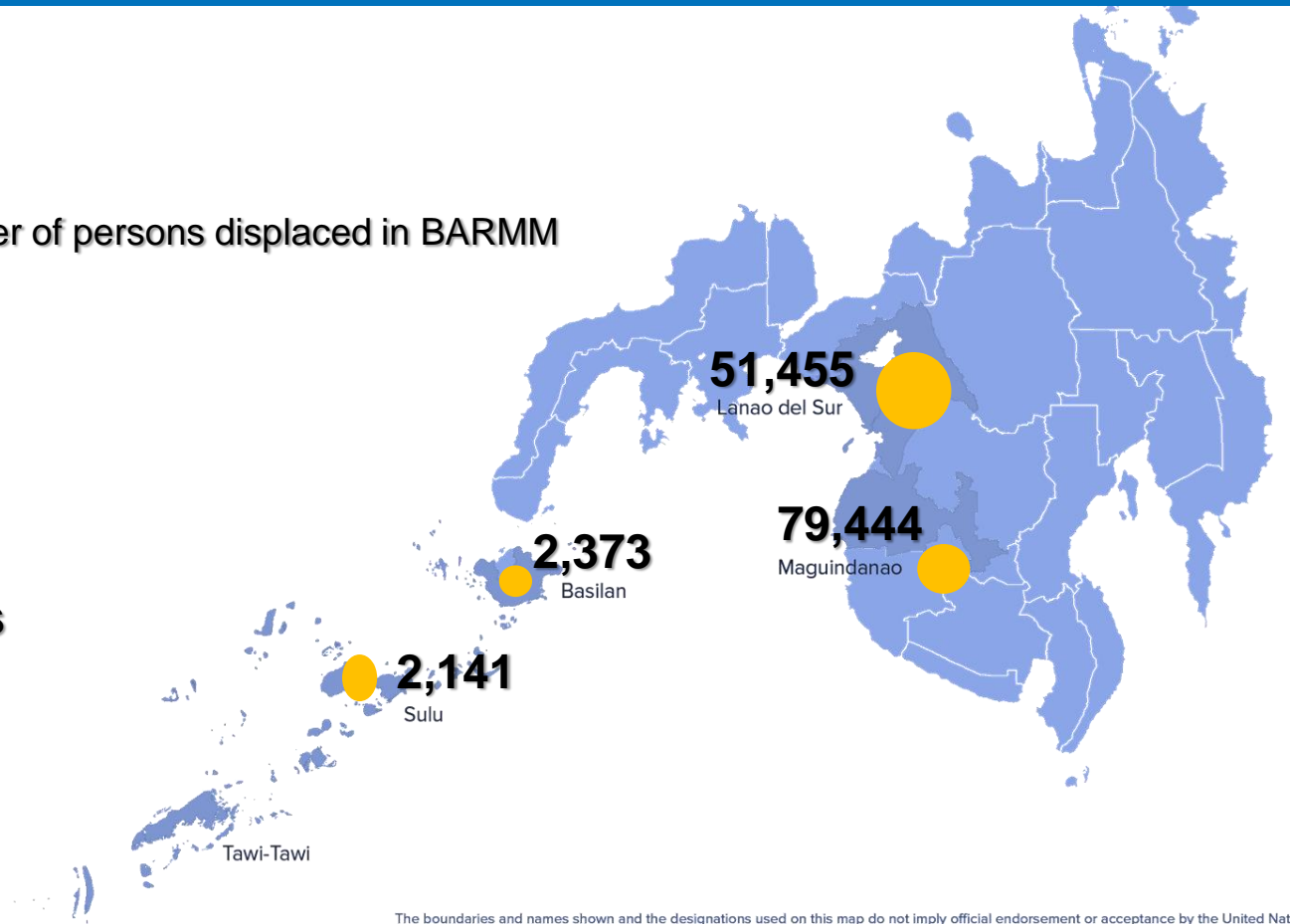

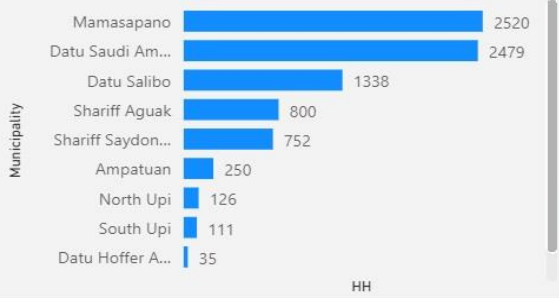
Displacement in SPMS box Maguindanao due to AFP vs BIFF armed conflict

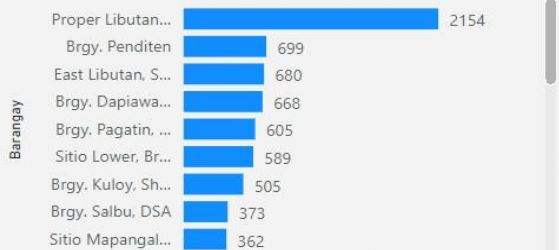

Protection Issues/Needs of IDPs at the Transitory Sites

Sector	Issues/Needs/Gaps
WASH	<p>Full septic tanks. Some of the IDP families had dug to re-direct the waste. While there are some whose tanks were connected to the drainage that gives foul smell and increases health risks.</p> <p>Insufficient water supply. Water rations continue on a schedule basis. Most of the families are buying water for cleaning and drinking.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In Area 6, the financially capable are paying the fuel for the water truck to be able to get water.• In Boganga, the water rations continues and there are some divisions that have water pumps that are dependent to source of electric power. Some IDPs are using the water rations and pumped water for drinking. The BARMM government has conducted the desludging of septic tanks in Boganga but only 150 families were served.• In Rorogagus, IDPs are paying P300 per month for their water consumption. Accordingly, the water rations had stopped for several reasons, including security as there are cases that occupants threatened the truck driver.
Food Security and Livelihood	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No livelihood or source of income due to limited job offer within the vicinity and lack of livelihood assistance. Many had used its capital to cope up during strict community quarantines.• Most of the family expressed that they have difficulties in accessing nutritious food and food assistance due to pandemic situation and lack of budget to buy their stuff or daily needs.• Selected families from the Barangays in MAA have received cash assistance from MSSD-BARMM for their start-up capital for livelihoods.

Marawi Displacement

Protection Issues/Needs of IDPs at the Transitory Sites

Sector	Issues/Needs/Gaps
Safety and Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• There are houses that are prone to flash flood in Boganga TS particularly in Division 7 where soil erosion/landslide happens during rainy days.• Lack of streetlights at the transitory sites poses protection risks to women and children.
Access to Basic Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• There is difficulty in accessing basic facilities/ services including hospitals, pharmacies, markets and schools due to far distance of the transitory sites and the high transportation cost.• There is available e-trike from the LGU but on a schedule basis and can only accommodate maximum of 6 passengers in one trip.
Health	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• There is mobile health stations at the site but there are mothers who reported that it lacks medicines and other equipment.• IDPs have also fear of going to hospital due to COVID19. People opt for traditional means of treating their family members who have fever and cough, while others opt to buy over the counter medicines.

Marawi Displacement

Protection Issues/Needs of IDPs at Dulay Permanent Shelter

- Potential electrical hazards because of poorly installed electricity which poses significant risk to the families. One of the IDP has relayed that there was an incident that the electrical connection has sparked.
- Lack of supply of water. The available water system for the families are not yet operational because of poorly installed electricity. They get water from their neighbors, but it is still not enough.
- Families faced difficulties in continuing their livelihood activities especially those who have to travel to where they have established their livelihood as the transportation cost is very high. Some families have not fully occupied their shelter because of this.
- Lack of livelihood. There are still families who have no source of income. They have cooperative but accordingly it is not enough to sustain the need of their families. (No concrete info on the number of families needing livelihood assistance).

Displacement in Malabang, Picong, Calanugas, Pualas

- There were 627 families (approximately 3,434 individuals) who were forced to flee their homes in the municipalities of Calanugas, Malabang, Picong and Pualas when an armed encounter has erupted as a result of counter terrorism operation conducted by the security force on 17 March.
- All displaced families have returned to their places of origin a few days after they were displaced.

Barangay Benembengan, Sumisip Municipality	Lingering fear due to presence of alleged ASG in the area. Sporadic exchanges if there is a patrol operation of the government forces, the alleged member of ASG uses force such as giving of a warning bullet shots to the government forces.	The Municipal Mayor is planning for settlement however the alleged member of ASG refuses for the settlement.
Barangay Babag (Babuan Island), Tabuan Lasa Municipality	Prolong displacement due to unresolved long standing dispute between rival families. Fear of possible firefight between the two involved families	There is on-going peace negotiation between the parties to amicably settle the dispute.
Barangay Langgung, Hadji Mohammad Ajul Municipality	Recurring tensions due to unresolved family feud. Other party demanding the compensation to damaged property from the rival family.	MPOC and other peace building organization to intervene.
Barangay Tuburan Proper, Hadji Mohammad Ajul Municipality	Prolong displacement due to unresolved long standing dispute between rival families.	MPOC and other peace building organization to intervene.
Barangay BoheBaca, Tipo-tipo Municipality	The frequent and simultaneous movement of both AFP and the MILF to pursue alleged drug-pushers creates fear and anxiety among the civilians.	Proper dissemination of information on anti-drug campaign. MPOC to facilitate peace dialogue with the family of the alleged drug pushers.

SULU DISPLACEMENT

Protection Issues and Needs

- IDPs from Barangay Buhanginan have started constructing their houses in preparation for their return scheduled after the month Ramadhan. LGU also started the construction of communal latrine, farm-to-market road, and other basic facilities.
- 99 protracted IDP families from Barangay Bud Bunga, Talipao Municipality who were displaced since 2001 and 2014 are already scheduled to return home on April 8, 2021 after almost 20 years of displacement.
- Identified needs of returning IDPs are construction materials for the repair of their houses, financial assistance, solar lamps, sleeping mats, hygiene kits, protective gear such face mask, face shield, water container, and food packs.

Assistance and Services Provided in Barangay Bud Bunga

- PHP 5,000.00 financial assistance and 1 sack of rice each IDP family from Gov. Sakur S. Tan;
- 1 sack of rice each IDP family from MSSD;
- Vegetable Seeds and 20 Mahogani seedling from MAFAR;
- Free haircut from AFP;
- Mosquito nets from RHU-Talipao;
- 1 sack of rice, canned goods, Noodles, Kitchen Utensils, Sleeping mats, Slippers from MLGU- Talipao

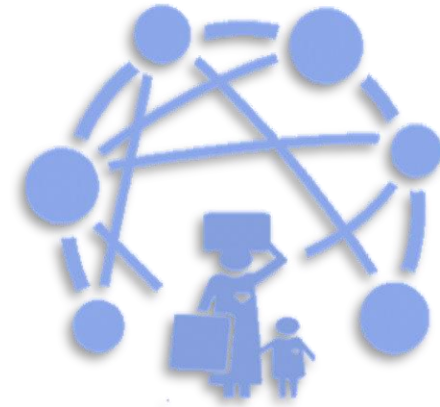

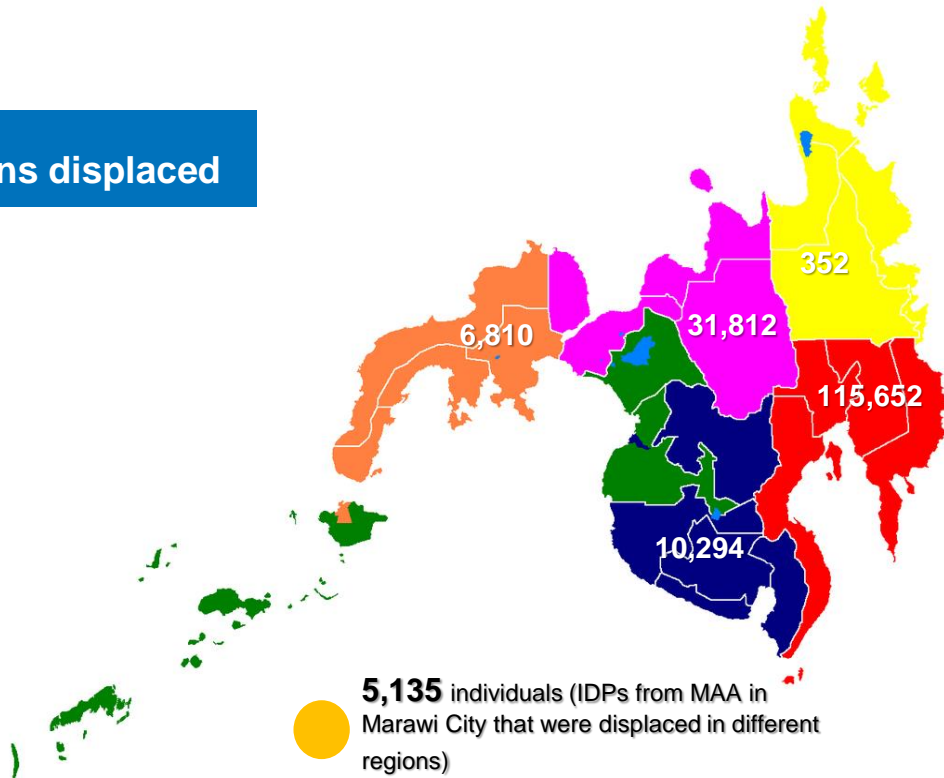

Zamboanga IDPs

- The acquired list of remaining IDPs in Masepla is 93 families, that is subject for revalidation scheduled on 7 April 2021 with the CSWDO staff.
- Conducted focus group discussion to assess the protection issues and needs of different sectors such as women, elderlies, children/ youth, and men.

ISSUES AND NEEDS

Zamboanga IDPs

- Access to WASH such as latrines and safe water.
- Significant cases of teenage pregnancy. They request for a session that will raise awareness of youth on the consequences of teenage pregnancy/ Adolescent Sexual Reproductive Health (ASRH)
- Issues raised that are related to Housing, Land and Property
- Need for psycho-social support. A 9-yearold girl is manifesting traumatic experience being linked to Zamboanga siege in 2013.
